a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.



January 23, 2017

The charge conference was called to order at 6:30 pm. The purpose of the meeting was to vote on incorporation of The Gathering at Scott Memorial United Methodist Church (the "Corporation"). Char James was elected as recording secretary.

Discussion ensued about the Articles of Incorporation and who the Directors are who are eligible to vote. The Registered Agent, Brett Thompson, who prepared the Articles of Incorporation will be directed to amend the Articles to reflect that, if the Corporation is dissolved at any time in the future, all property reverts to the United Methodist Church (see attached). Mr. Thompson will also be directed to amend the name on the Bylaws of the Corporation to reflect the following: The Gathering at Scott Memorial **United Methodist Church** (spelled out...not UMC).

There were eight (8) Directors present eligible to vote. Incorporation of The Gathering at Scott Memorial United Methodist Church was unanimously approved by those voting.
