For Organizations

Financial and Legal Documentation

- Housing payments (to identify financial records and obligations)

Some individuals and households may experience financial difficulty because of the pandemic. If you do not think you can pay your loan payments on time, immediately contact your bank and discuss your options before skipping any payments or taking any other actions contrary to the terms of your loans.

- Insurance policies (to re-establish financial accounts)
- Sources of income (to maintain payments and credit)
- Tax statements (to provide contact information for financial and legal providers and to apply for FEMA disaster assistance)

Medical Information

- Physician information (in case medical care is needed)
- Copies of health insurance information (to make sure existing care continues uninterrupted)
- Immunization records
- Medications

The research is clear:

- A child not reading at grade level by the end of first grade has an 88% chance of not reading at grade level by the end of fourth grade.
- Children not reading proficiently by third grade are 4 times more likely to drop out of school.

Our local campaign, **Virginia Beach READS**, is our city's effort to energize the entire community around the critical issue of ensuring all children are reading on or above grade level by third grade.

Each month the children are given one free take home book to build their home library and encourage reading outside of school.

Together our programs, including First Grade READS, work to encourage a love of reading in our children and strengthen their literacy skills.

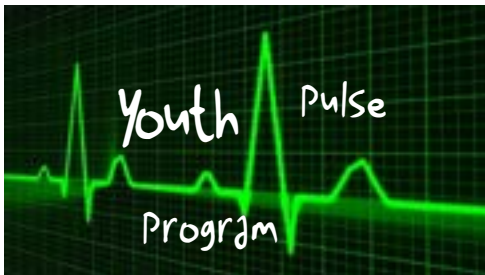

Self-Care Tips: Setting Boundaries

Setting boundaries isn't always easy. Letting people know our needs and limits are can often be stressful, especially if we are prone to be a people pleaser or always say yes. The first step in setting boundaries is to know your personal limits and boundaries. It is important to learn how to say no. Saying no demonstrates what you are willing to accept in a relationship, decreases excess stress and resentment from saying yes when you don't want to. Also, it limits regret, when you say "yes" to things that don't align with your values. Simple comments such as "Thank you for thinking of me, but I can't this time", "I'm super busy right now, but let's plan for another time" or "I can see that you don't give up easily, but I'm not changing my mind." are kind ways to say no to people and to keep our boundaries.

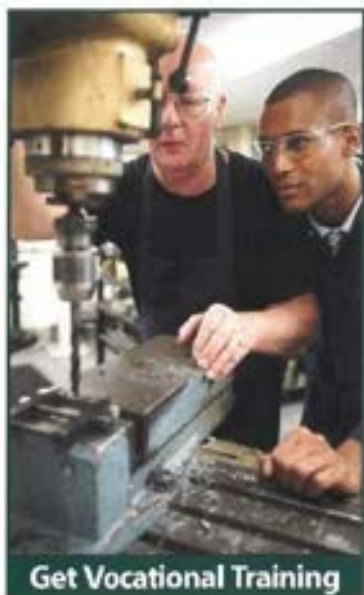
